

COMBAT CONTROLLER WOUNDED IN ACTION report from Wayne Norrad, CMSgt, USAF Retired, 720th Special Tactics Group

January 29, 2010 – Somewhere in Afghanistan -- TSgt Doug Neville of the 22 STS, McChord AFB, Washington suffered a gunshot wound to his right leg. The bullet struck him in the calf, exited, then entered and lodged in his thigh. The bullet was removed and he is now stable. He was also hit by another round into the back chest plate of his body armor, but suffered no wound from that round. Lastly, he fractured his right ankle after jumping off the roof to take cover from sniper fire.
